Blockchain technology introduces new value propositions

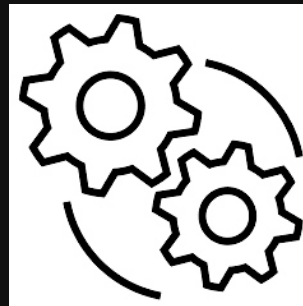


Single system of record enables **“trustless” consensus** and direct, low-cost transactions between parties

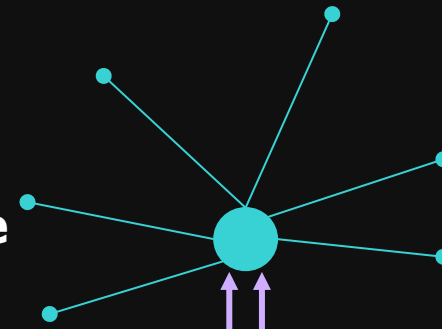

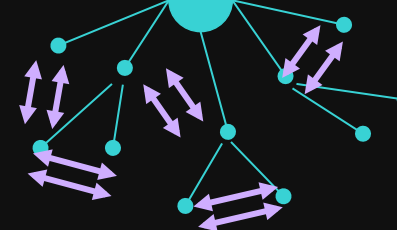

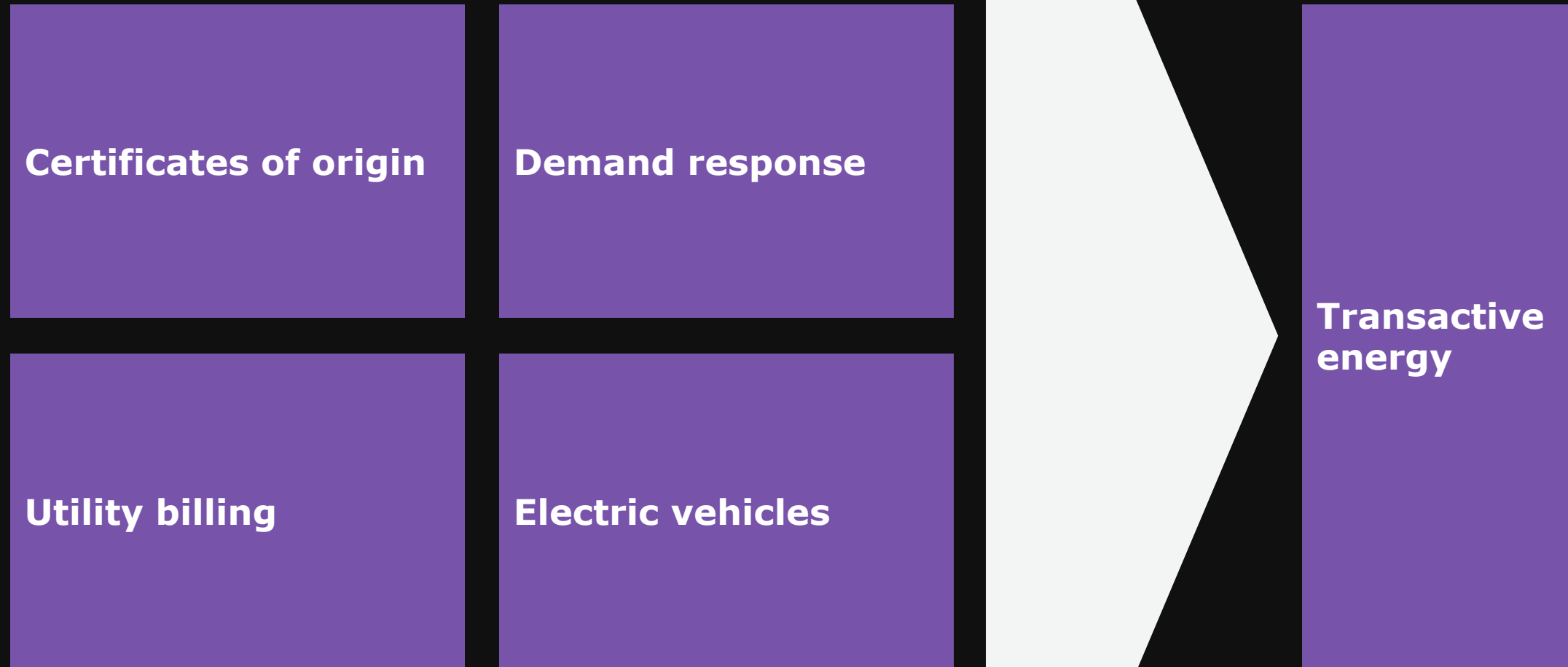
Energy Web Foundation (EWF) is leveraging blockchain to enable and accelerate the global clean energy transition
